

Proposition 2: The Pembrokeshire Food Park SLES



Proposition 2 is centred around the
Pembrokeshire Food Park, a planned
development for a food distribution centre
in Haverfordwest, alongside the planned
10MW Haverfordwest airfield solar PV, and
PCC transport hub plans in Haverfordwest.
There is strong interplay between the demand
energy vectors (heating, cooling, electricity and
hydrogen) and a significant opportunity to utilise
local waste products to fulfil this demand.

As a new-build proposal, the food park could be designed to take advantage of no regret technologies, particularly anaerobic digestion, biogas cold climate heat pump and polyvalent heat pumps. These can be integrated via heating and cooling distribution networks.

Utilising excess PV generation to electrolyse hydrogen locally would be a cost-effective method of meeting some transport demand.

If local hydrogen transport demand grows this proposition could form a local hydrogen transport hub.
